## **CRAGIFLOWER PUMP STATION - PROGRESS UPDATE FOR JUNE, 2014** RE:

Further to the last notification letter that was distributed in the fall of 2013, we are providing this letter as an update on the construction progress of Craigflower Pump Station.

The construction of the new pump station is progressing well and the substructure is almost complete. In the near future residents will be able to see the above ground structure taking shape.

The contractor, Jacob Bros. Construction Ltd., will now be commencing with excavating a pit for the trenchless crossing work on the school field side (see attached site plan for reference). Based on the contractor's schedule most of the pipe work in the school field is expected to be completed by the end of summer. However, some manhole tie-in work may need to be coordinated when the school session resumes in the fall.

The contractor has prepared Safety and Traffic Management Plans which include directing traffic, bicycles and pedestrians around the work zones in a safe manner. Whenever possible, work will be conducted between the hours of 7:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday to Saturday, however, some critical portions of the project may require work outside of this window. We ask for your help in observing all signs and obeying the traffic control personnel while construction is underway.

The contractor will provide advance notification should traffic lanes on Shoreline Drive be temporarily disrupted and, in such cases, they will provide temporary access around the work zone. The Seaterra Program will keep Shoreline Middle School and the Town of View Royal staff informed of the work as it progresses, and signage will be placed at key locations around the work zone.
