Evolution of the Water Conservation Bylaw

- 1992 Mandatory watering schedules were approved by resolution for the Western Communities and Sooke and the other municipalities were requested to implement similar restrictions from August 10 October 2. Stage 2 lawn watering was restricted to one inch once per week according to house number. No enforcement. Should not be considered as Stage 1.
- 1993 Stage 1 voluntary restrictions included lawn watering twice per week, no washing sidewalks, parking lots, turn off fountains that do not recycle water, etc. from February 26 August 27. Enforcement was by the municipalities except in the Western Communities where the GVWD1 enforced it.
- 1994 No restrictions.
- 1995 Stage 1 voluntary restrictions from June 3 July 21 (see 1993 for extent of restrictions & enforcement). Stage 2 restrictions July 22 August 18 which reduced lawn watering to once per week between 4 -9 am and 7 10 p.m.
- 1996 1998 No restrictions.
- 1999 Stage 1 restrictions in effect that limited lawn watering to two days per week between certain hours from June 10 September 30. No enforcement.
- 2000 Restrictions were in effect from June 1 to September 30. Stage 1 restrictions limit lawn watering to two days per week. No enforcement.
- 2001 2002 Stage 3 Water Conservation Bylaw (no lawn watering) from April 2 December 18, 2001. Stage 2 watering schedule in effect from December 18, 2001 January 8, 2002. Prior to 2001 there was no concerted effort to administer or enforce the Water Conservation Bylaw region wide.
- 2002 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from July 1 September 30 (delayed from June 1 to July 1 to permit lowering of Sooke Lake Reservoir to accommodate dam construction work).
- 2003 Raising of the Sooke Lake Reservoir dam to increase capacity.
 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1 to September 30. The bylaw was amended to put in place annual watering schedules from May 1 each year.
- 1 Greater Victoria Water District (GVWD) until 1997 when it became the Water Services Department within the CRD.

- 2004 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1 to September 30.
- 2005 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1 to September 30. The township of Sidney rescinded its Watering Bylaw so that CRD could then administer & enforce the CRD Water Conservation Bylaw.
- 2006 2009 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1- September 30.
- 2009 CRD enlisted to enforce the Water Conservation Bylaw in Colwood as of Oct 1, 2009.
- 2010 2014 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1- September 30.
- 2015 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1- September 30. Province Issued Drought Level 4. CRD remained at Stage 1. Marks the centennial anniversary of the Sooke Lake Reservoir.
- 2016 Water Conservation Bylaw amended (3061 replaced to 4099). Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1- September 30. Province issued Drought Levels 2, 3 & 4 from May 19 October 4.
- 2017 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1 September 30. Province issued Drought Levels 2 & 3 from July 6 to October 18.
- 2018 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1 September 30. Province issued Drought Levels 2, 3 & 4 from June 14 September 20.
- 2019 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1 September 30. Province issued Drought Levels 2 & 3 from May 30 September 18.
- 2020 Water Conservation Bylaw amended to reduce enforcement and ticketing (remained 4099).
 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1- September 30. Province issued Drought Level 2 & 3 from July 12 October 3.
- 2021 Stage 1 Water Conservation Bylaw from May 1 September 30. Province issued Drought Level 2 on May 26 and Drought Level 4 on July 7.
