

CRCHN 2023 Priorities

Background:

The CRCHN's mission is to build and sustain healthy communities within the Capital Regional District by facilitating discussions and catalyzing action around the social, economic and environmental determinants of health. To do this the CRCHN:

- Provides data and indicators around the social determinants of health as a means to track regional progress in these areas
- Acts as a conduit for information and catalyst for action around data/indicators on the determinants of health and well-being to influence social planning, strategic priority setting, and public health policy
- Acts as a platform for collaboration, networking and partnership building
- Helps community organizations build capacity¹ within the Capital Regional District

The ROM-CHN's work is focused on 10 goal areas:

- Affordable and Accessible Housing
- Economic Security
- Food Security
- Thriving Children and Youth
- Healthy and Safe Environments
- Recreation and Active Living
- Connection to Arts and Culture
- Accessible Human Services
- Inclusive, Connected Communities
- Lifelong Learning

The 2020-2024 Strategic Plan outlines four objectives for the network:

- Facilitate knowledge and capacity development around data and indicators of health and wellness, and the determinants of health and wellness
- Facilitate networking the networks²
- Deepen the health and sustainability of our network
- Support networks/agencies/organizations in applying for funding opportunities

To organize this work, the CRCHN Terms of Reference states that annual work plans are to be created each year. The plan below outlines the CRCHN's 2022 goals and associated activities. The plan recognizes the importance of taking a holistic approach to public health but also the need to balance this holistic approach with manageable workloads based on capacity. It is also acknowledged that the role of the network is to facilitate and amplify community work and not to generate new programs.

¹ Capacity building projects are determined by the ROM-CHN steering committee based on their needs and the needs they see within the non-profit sector.

² Networking the networks brings together different networks across the CRD to build partnerships, learn about network health and strengthen their own capacity.
