The day was a great success as we met with hundreds of Pender residents to discuss what we can do to improve the lives of the people on our islands.

Funding Update

Our most exciting news to share is our latest milestone: a \$500,000 grant from the Province of British Columbia's Active Transportation Infrastructure Program for the Schooner Way Trail Project.

These grant dollars wouldn't have been possible without the pledges of Pender residents and businesses, which enabled us to meet the funder's criteria for

But wait, there's more good news. We're delighted to announce we've received a \$65,000 Capital and Innovation Program grant from the Island Coastal Economic Trust. Plus, we're exploring innovative ways to stretch our budget further and keep costs under control, including repurposing materials from The Dip road realignment project on South Pender.
