Technical Notes

E.A. = Electoral Area

Municipal Boundaries have changed:

(1) On Dec. 6, 1999, a portion of the former Sooke Electoral Area was incorporated as Sooke District. The remaining unincorporated portion of the Sooke E.A., together with the Langford E.A., were combined into a new Juan de Fuca E.A. Because the incorporation of Sooke District occurred after the taking of the 1996 Census, demographics are not available for Sooke District nor the Juan de Fuca E.A. for the 1996 Census. Statistics for these new jurisdictions are, however included in the 2001 Census.

(2) 2006 Census Population counts are for geographic boundaries as of Jan 1st, 2006.

Changes to Sooke's and Juan de Fuca E.A.'s boundaries due to Sooke boundary extensions to the East (Gillespie Rd) and to the West (Kemp Lake/West Coast Road) in Feb 2006 are not reflected in these counts.

(3) Juan de Fuca E.A. is comprised of two parts in the 2001 Census data: Capital H (Part 1), RDA and Capital H (Part 2), RDA. Capital H (Part 1) is commonly known as Juan de Fuca, East Sooke, Malahat and Willis Point; Capital H (Part 2) is commonly known as Juan de Fuca West and includes Port Renfrew. The Household Income Household Income data shown in this table are for Capital H (Part 1) only, which has a total of 1,740 private households. Income data for Capital H (Part 2), which has a total of 110 private households have been suppressed. The total number of private households in Juan de Fuca E.A. is 1,850.

Household Total Income - The total income of a household is the sum of the total incomes of all members of that household.

Total income refers to the total money income received from the following sources during calendar year 2000 by persons 15 years of age and over:

- wages and salaries (total);
- net farm income;
- net non-farm income from unincorporated business and/or professional practice;
- child benefits;
- Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement;
- benefits from Canada or Quebec Pension Plan;
- benefits from Employment Insurance;
- other income from government sources;
- dividends, interest on bonds, deposits and savings certificates, and other investment income;
- retirement pensions, superannuation and annuities, including those from RRSPs and RRIFs;
- other money income.

After-tax income of households - The after-tax income of a household is the sum of the after-tax incomes of all members of that household. After-tax income of household members refers to total income from all sources minus federal, provincial and territorial taxes paid for 2005.

Receipts not counted as income - The income concept excludes gambling gains and losses, lottery prizes, money inherited during the year in a lump sum, capital gains or losses, receipts from the sale of property, income tax refunds, loan payments received, lump sum settlements of insurance policies, rebates received on property taxes, refunds of pension contributions as well as all income 'in kind', such as free meals and living accommodations, or agricultural products produced and consumed on the farm.
