

CRD Blue Bag Materials Accepted

- ✓ Clean newspapers & inserts



- ✓ Clean mixed paper products—stationery, computer paper, file folders, envelopes, newsletters, flyers, magazines, catalogues, cereal boxes, detergent boxes, paper towel rolls, toilet paper rolls, greeting cards, paper egg cartons



- ✓ Shred personal documents—place shredded or torn paper in a paper bag, cereal box or other non-corrugated box inside your CRD blue bag



Remember ...

- Include clean paper products only
- Place materials loosely in your CRD blue bag
- Shred papers containing personal identity information
- Place shredded or torn paper in a paper bag, cereal box or other non-corrugated box inside your CRD blue bag

*Paper is banned from the garbage



CRD Blue Box Materials Accepted

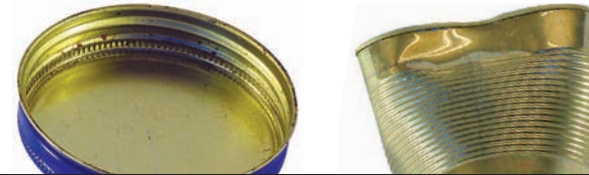
- ✓ Clean rigid plastic packaging from consumer goods (e.g.: tools, electronics), food (e.g.: salads, baked goods), empty CD/DVD/VHS protective cases



- ✓ Clean rigid plastic containers—yogurt and margarine containers, shampoo/liquid soap bottles, cleaning product containers, pill/vitamin bottles, clean plant pots, plastic milk jugs



- ✓ Clean plastic & metal lids
- ✓ Clean aluminum & tin cans



- ✓ Clean glass bottles & jars
- ✓ Clean foil & foil plates (no food residue)



Remember ...

- Clean containers and rigid plastic packaging only
- Place materials loosely in CRD blue box, no sorting required
- Take lids off containers, then place them in your CRD blue box
- Flatten metal and plastic containers whenever possible
- Maximum container size: 10 litres
- No plastic bags or Styrofoam
- No drink or milk cartons



Cardboard Materials Accepted

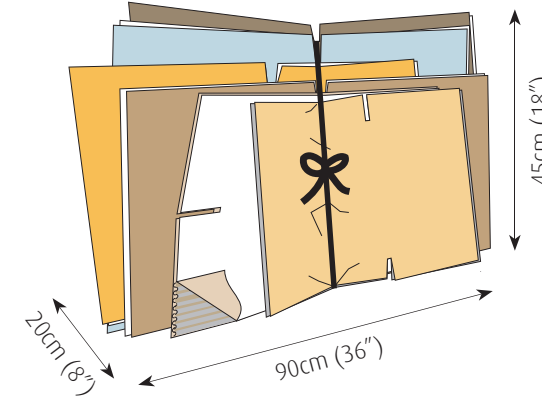
- ✓ Clean corrugated cardboard



- ✓ Clean pizza boxes—Remove and discard food residue, liners and inserts from boxes; turn pizza boxes inside out



- ✓ Maximum bundle size



Remember ...

- Flatten and bundle pizza boxes and cardboard
- Include clean items only
- Tie bundles with string or twine (no tape or wire)
- Maximum bundle size: 90 cm x 45 cm x 20 cm (36"x18"x 8")

*Cardboard is banned from the garbage



Not Accepted

- No household hazardous waste, motor oil or antifreeze containers



- No ceramics, sheet glass, pane glass or glassware



- No hangers (wood, plastic or wire)



- No plastic bags or Styrofoam



- No drink or milk cartons



Remember ...

- An unlimited amount of recyclables from your home can be left at the curb in CRD blue boxes or blue bags (use of other containers permitted provided they are not larger in volume than 47 litres or 12 gallons and are used in conjunction with a CRD blue box or blue bag)
- Blue boxes or blue bags will be left behind if they contain items other than those listed; drivers will "tag" contaminated blue boxes and blue bags so that residents can remove non-recyclables for the next collection day
- Glass, tin and rigid plastic containers and plastic packaging may be mixed together in the CRD blue box
