



## Common Native Plants for Sunny Garden Conditions

### Sunny/Moist

#### Trees

- Big leaf maple (*Acer macrophyllum*)
- Red alder (*Alnus rubra*)
- Black cottonwood (*Populus balsamifera* subs: *trichocarpa*)
- Bitter cherry (*Prunus emarginata*)
- Black hawthorn (*Crataegus douglasii*)
- Pacific crabapple (*Malus-fusca*)
- Pacific dogwood (*Cornus nutallii*)
- Western red cedar (*Thuja plicata*)
- Yellow cedar (*Chamaecyparis nootkatensis*)

#### Shrubs

- Hardhack (*Spiraea douglasii*)
- Red-osier dogwood (*Cornus stolonifera*)
- Red elderberry (*Sambucus racemosa*)
- Blue elderberry (*Sambucus cerulean*)
- Black twinberry (*Lonicera involucrata*)
- Nootka rose (*Rosa nutkana*)
- Pacific ninebark (*Physocarpus capitatus*)
- Salmonberry (*Rubus spectabilis*)
- Thimbleberry (*Rubus parviflorus*)
- Willow (*Salix lucida*, *S. scouleriana*) \* *There is a variety (Salix alba) that is considered invasive and exotic*
- Beaked hazelnut (*Conylus cornuta* var. *californica*)

#### Herbs/Ferns

- Sword fern (*Polystichum munitum*)
- Pacific bleeding heart (*Dicentra formosa*)
- Stream violet (*Viola glabella*)
- Checker mallow (*Sidalcea hendersonii*)

- Blue and yellow-eyed grass (*Sisyrinchium californicum*, *S. idahoense*)
- Monkey flower (*Mimulus guttatus*, *M. Lewisii*)

## Sunny/Dry

### Trees

- Douglas fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii* ssp. *menziesii*)
- Grand fir (*Abies grandis*)
- Choke cherry (*Prunus virginiana*)
- Pacific dogwood (*Cornus nutallii*)
- Arbutus (*Arbutus menziesii*)
- Garry oak (*Quercus garryana*)
- Shore pine (*Pinus contorta* var. *contorta*)

### Shrubs

- Red flowering currant (*Ribes sanguineum*)
- Common snowberry (*Symphoricarpos albus*)

- Camas (*Camassia quamash*, *C. leichtlini*)
- Yarrow (*Achillea millefolium*)\*This species can be aggressive and may be considered invasive
- Yellow marsh marigold \*Invasive varieties exist
- Nodding onion (*Allium cernuum*)
- Canada goldenrod (*Solidago canadensis*)\* Invasive varieties exist (*S. rugosa*) is introduced
- Northern goldenrod (*Solidago multiradiata*) Invasive varieties exist (*S. rugosa*) is introduced
- Pearly everlasting (*Anaphalis margaritacea*)

- Penstemon (*Penstemon serrulatus*) \*There are many varieties that are non-native/invasive
- Western buttercup (*Ranunculus occidentalis*) \* *R. repens* is an invasive variation of the Western buttercup
- Coastal strawberry (*Frageria chiloensis*)
- Woodland strawberry (*Frageria vesca*)

## Sunny/Rock

### Trees

- Field chickweed (*Cerastium arvense*)
- Pussetoes (*Antennaria microphylla*, *A. neglecta*)
- Siberian sea thrift (*Armeria maritima*) \*There is one variety of non-native/invasive
