



Native Plants for Rock Gardens

Native Plants for Rock Walls/Rocky Surfaces, Cracks and Crevices

- Stonecrop (*Sedum spathulifolium, lanceolatum, oregonum*); Evergreen- yellow flower- grows in cracks and crevice). * *S. acre* is an invasive variety.
- Nodding onion (*Allium cernuum*); Evergreen- pretty pink/mauve flower
- Pussytoes (*Antennaria microphylla, A. neglecta*); Short perennial flower with woolly leaves.
- Alumroot (*Heuchera glabra, H. micrantha*); Evergreen in mild winters- hardy
- Licorice fern (*Polypodium glycyrrhiza*); dies back in summer-winter greenery
- Sword fern (*Polystichum munitum*); Evergreen
- Camas (*Camassia quamas, C. leichtlinii*); blue purple flower
- Satin flower (*Sisyrinchium douglasii*); dainty purple spring rock flower
- Sea blush (*Plectritis congesta*); annual, spreads easily, masses of pink flowers
- Spring gold (*Lomatium utriculatum*); loves rocky outcrops
- Shooting star (*Dodecatheon hendersonii, D. pulchellum, D. jeffreyi*) Magenta/purple dangling flower
- Hooker's onion (*Allium acuminatum*); purple flowers
- Woolly sunflower (*Eriophyllum lanatum*); yellow daisy-like flower
- Columbia lewisia (*Lewisia columbiana*); glorious pink flower
- Siberian sea thrift (*Armeria maritima*); Evergreen-white and pink flowers
- Kinnickinick (*Artostaphylos uva-ursi*); Evergreen
- Penstemon (*Penstemon serrulatus*); great color *There are many varieties that are non-native/invasive
- Menzie's larkspur (*Delphinium menziesii*); blue flower
- Saxifrage (*Saxifraga ferruginea, S. integrifolia, S. mertensiana, S. occifentelis*); clusters of small flowers.
- Harebell (*Capanula rotundifolia*); charming bell-shaped flower, rocky crevice
- Moss campion (*Silene acaulis*); a mound of green-tiny flowers
- Fool's onion (*Brodiaea hyacinthina*); white flower, long stem
- Harvest brodiaea (*Brodiaea coronaria*); tiny purple flower, summer bloom
- Monkey flower (*Mimulus alsinoides, M. lewisii*); tiny yellow flowers, found in cracks and crevices
- Goldenback fern (*Pityrogramma triangularis*); likes moist crevices, shade
- Parsley fern (*Cryptogramma crispera*); pretty fern
