## **CRD Arts Development Service**

### Mission

The CRD supports, promotes and celebrates the arts.

### Vision

The arts are central to the life in our communities.

The CRD Arts Development Service administers funding programs that support not-for-profit arts organizations. The service has two committees: the Arts Committee, and the Arts Advisory Council.

The Arts Committee is comprised of elected representatives, one from each of the eight contributing municipalities of Victoria, Saanich, Oak Bay, Esquimalt, Metchosin, Highlands, View Royal and Sidney. The Arts Advisory Council is a volunteer council, appointed by the Arts Committee, who act as adjudicators for grant programs and provide advice to the Arts Committee on issues related to the arts.

### Arts Committee

The Arts Committee (AC) is responsible for support and development of the arts in the region through:

- overseeing operational and project support to arts organizations
- considering policies aimed at creating an environment conducive to a wide range of arts activities
- approval of overall Arts Development budget

## Arts Advisory Council

The Arts Advisory Council (AAC) was established by CRD Bylaw 2973 to provide advice to the AC on policies to foster and promote the arts through:

- support of the arts in the community
- public awareness of and involvement in the arts
- the creation, exhibition and performance of the artistic works
- the development of artistic and other requisite skills.

The AAC also adjudicates grant applications and provides recommendations to the AC for final approval. Current funding programs include operating grants (one intake per year) and Project Grants (two intakes per year). The CRD is unable to fund individuals or businesses and only funds not-for-profit organizations.

The AAC consists of up to twelve volunteer members who are appointed by the AC. The membership reflects a wide range of experience and interest in the arts as well as other professions. AAC positions are non-paid.

AAC members should have expertise that may include training and work experience in an arts discipline or other occupation including law, business, accounting, or administration. Familiarity with the not-for-profit sector, policy development, public sector funding, grant adjudication, finance, governance or other fields related to the responsibilities of an AAC member are assets.

### **Time Commitment**

The AAC has regular meetings on the first Tuesday of each month with the exception of July and August. An all-day Saturday meeting replaces the regular meeting in November when operating grants are reviewed. A December meeting is at the call of the Chair. A half-day planning meeting with the Arts Committee is typically scheduled in the spring.

### **Eligibility**

A person is disqualified from being appointed to and from serving on the Council who:

- (i) is a member of the board of directors of any organization applying for funding
- (ii) is a paid or unpaid (i.e. a volunteer) staff member of any organization applying for funding
- (iii) has, directly or indirectly, by him/herself or through any other person, any interest in a contract with or for an organization applying for funding.

### **Selection and Appointment**

Applications are reviewed according to provisions contained in the Establishing Bylaw for the Arts Advisory Council. Prospective appointees are selected based on the current needs of the Council. Final approval and appointments are made by the AC. Initial appointments are for one year with the possibility of reappointment for subsequent terms, to a maximum of eight years.
