We are witnessing the enormous impact COVID-19 is having on an industry that relies on audience attendance, convening artists and traveling in order to fulfill their mandates and make an income. We are also seeing a rise in creative responses that make bold steps towards resiliency with through alternative presentation formats that follow the directives of the Provincial Health Officer.

CRD Arts Commission Approves Arts & Culture Project Grants for 25 Arts Organizations

The Capital Regional District (CRD) Arts Commission has approved \$122,500 in funding for 25 local not-for-profit arts organizations through the Arts & Culture Support Service. "Despite the challenges posed to presenters due to COVID-19, we are committed to supporting arts and cultural organizations," said CRD Arts Commission Chair Jeremy Loveday.

Event Planning for Grant Recipients and Grant Applicants

We recognize that the directive from the Provincial Health Officer to maintain social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic creates uncertainty for organizations planning arts initiatives, preparing funding applications and managing grants. We are requesting that:

- Organizations preparing applications program their events well in advance using presentation formats that follow directives from the Provincial Health Officer.
- Organizations with successful grant proposals that have significant changes or are planning to reschedule, are required to [inform our office](#).

Project Grants

CRD Arts & Culture will proceed with the upcoming deadline of April 30th 2020 for the Projects, Series and Extended Programming Grant program. Our purpose is to maintain predictability for applicants and stability in our support of the arts community. Apply for a grant if your arts and culture project will:

- Take into account current and anticipated directives from the Provincial Health Officer;
- Benefit the communities in the capital region;
- Positively impact the development of the arts in the capital region; and/or
- Contribute to the artistic development of artists, the art form and to your organization.

Steps to Apply

1. Contact us to confirm eligibility and request an application form.
2. Review our [FAQs](#) and the [guidelines](#).
3. Complete the application and provide a digital copy by 4:30pm on the deadline.

Operating Grants

We want to provide assurance that the Arts Commission and the Arts & Culture Support Service continue to support the sector and that Operating Grant funding will be released on the usual schedule. As usual, organizations can request an early payment (generally up to 50%) beginning April 1. Early payments are subject to a carrying charge through July 30. If you have not requested an early payment and your situation has changed [please contact us](#). Organizations not requiring an early payment will receive full payment of their approved grant on August 1 as usual.
