

# REPORT TO CORE AREA LIQUID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 13, 2013

## SUBJECT CORE AREA WASTEWATER TREATMENT PROGRAM 2013 BUDGET

# <u>ISSUE</u>

To obtain approval for the 2013 Capital Budget and for the Core Area Wastewater Treatment Program (CAWTP) Capital Plan.

## BACKGROUND

With the official announcement of funding in July 2012, the CAWTP moved from the planning phase to the implementation phase. In September, a budget was approved for six months with the expectation that the Core Area Wastewater Treatment Program Commission (Commission) would be in place for the 2013 budget process. As the Commission has not yet been appointed the Program Management Team (PMT) has prepared the 2013 budget to ensure funding approval for 2013 activities.

# **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. That the Core Area Liquid Waste Management Committee recommend to the Capital Regional District Board approval of the 2013 Capital Budget and the Core Area Wastewater Treatment Program (CAWTP) Capital Plan.
- 2. That the Core Area Liquid Waste Management Committee defer approval of the 2013 Capital Budget and Capital Plan pending receipt of additional information.

# FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

As summarized in the table below, the budget request for 2013 is \$47,376,000 with the remaining balance of the program budget planned for years 2014-2018. Refer to Appendix A for details.

Key activities planned for 2013 include:

- Complete the rezoning for McLoughlin Point and attenuation tank sites;
- Complete the acquisition of the McLoughlin wastewater treatment plant site;
- Issue the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the McLoughlin wastewater treatment project and receive submissions, shortlist respondents and issue the Request for Proposals (RFP) to shortlisted respondents;
- Complete the indicative design for the McLoughlin wastewater treatment plant, outfall and Victoria Harbour crossing and initiate the indicative design for biosolids facility;
- Complete design and award of the Craigflower Pump Station upgrade contract and start construction;
- Issue an RFP for design and construction consulting services, and retain consultant for the Arbutus Road Attenuation tank and other conveyance infrastructure; and
- Prepare the biosolids RFQ and issue the RFQ.

## CONCLUSION

The 2013 budget of \$47,376,000 and 2014-2018 Capital Plan are within the approved program budget of \$783,000,000 for the CAWTP.

# RECOMMENDATION

That the Core Area Liquid Waste Management Committee recommend to the Capital Regional District Board approval of the 2013 Capital Budget and the Core Area Wastewater Treatment Program (CAWTP) Capital Plan.
