#### REPORT TO ELECTORAL AREA SERVICES COMMITTEE MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, JULY 15, 2015

#### **SUBJECT** Replacement of Salt Spring Island Bus Fleet

#### **ISSUE**

To consider BC Transit's recommended bus procurement options to replace the Salt Spring Island fleet.

#### BACKGROUND

The Salt Spring Island existing 20-passenger Ford Polar vehicles are at the end of their useful life and slated to be replaced. In selecting replacement vehicles considerations are given to the physical constraints at Fulford Harbour (29 ft. maximum length for turn-around) and Vesuvius Bay Ferry Terminals, the rural nature and condition of many of Salt Spring Island roads, and current maintenance capacity. BC Transit has proposed two bus options to the Salt Spring Island Transportation Commission at their June 22, 2015 meeting. Based on the following comparison the SSITC recommended that BC Transit replace of the Salt Spring Island bus fleet with gasoline Light Duty (23 seats) Arboc buses.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. That the Electoral Area Services Committee recommends to BC Transit to replace the Salt Spring Island fleet with light duty 23 seat Arboc gasoline powered buses.
- 2. That the Electoral Area Services Committee recommends to BC Transit to replace the Salt Spring Island fleet with medium duty low floor diesel ~ 40 (24 seated) power buses.
- 3. That the Electoral Area Services Committee refer the matter back to staff for further information.

#### **IMPLICATIONS**

- 1. The light duty 23 seat Arboc gasoline powered buses are currently budgeted for within the three year budget projection. Operating contractor is responsible for operations and maintenance in regards to providing transit servicing. All maintenance can be supported by an on island provider.
- 2. Currently there are no on island service providers to service a medium duty bus. Having repairs done off island would cost approximately \$23,000 per year, and the service would require an additional bus to support fleet. The annual ongoing cost variance compared to light duty bus is approximately 31.8% more.

That the Electoral Areas Services Committee recommends to BC Transit to replace the Salt Spring Island fleet with light duty 23 seat Arboc gasoline powered buses.



#### **Applicant Profile**

The Sooke Fine Arts Show is an important regional arts event, playing a significant role in the arts, culture and heritage of BC's coastal island region. Attracting over 8,500 visitors a year, the show engages individuals of all ages in the arts and fosters interest and future skill development. Children and youth are given hands-on opportunities to learn, create and perform; kids 12 and under are granted free admission at all times, to encourage their exposure to and engagement with art, and make the show accessible to families. Seniors receive a discount on admission and enjoy two afternoons of fine tea and scones with their peers in the gallery. In addition to nearly 400 works of original island art, the show offers 40 live music performances and 35 live art demonstrations over 11 days, at no extra cost. It is a unique offering in a rural community with limited access to cultural events.

2. Describe the geographic area that receives services or benefits from your organization.

The show features 400 works by BC island artists; more than 80% of the 600 submitting artists live within the CRD. More than 3/4 of the show's 8500 visitors are also from the CRD. The show also features a youth art gallery with 100 works by local students from Sooke and Langford. All of the 300 volunteers are CRD residents.

The Sooke Fine Arts Society employs a full-time executive director and a part-time assistant with wages and benefits projected at \$70,063 for 2015. Volunteers and board members are not remunerated, but their efforts are recognized with awards, small gifts, lunches, a volunteer celebration after the show, and occasional gatherings during the year.

The Sooke Fine Arts Show is entering its 29th year of existence, the last 9 under the operation of the Sooke Fine Arts Society, which was formed in 2006. It currently counts 75 members, including a board of nine directors, and more than 300 Sooke Region volunteers who give an estimated 10,000 hours of their time each year to planning, setting up and operating the show.

The Sooke Fine Arts Show occupies a temporary 16,000-square-foot gallery built within the SEAPARC Leisure Complex's hockey arena. More than 375 works of art are individually lit to showcase them to best effect. Thanks to a grant by the Victoria Foundation, the show's halogen lights are being converted to LED in 2015 to reduce waste heat and electrical consumption, improving visitor comfort, environmental impact and heat damage to some works of art. Lighting is also needed for a small gift shop, featuring smaller works for sale by show artists, and the stage which features live music and artist talks daily. Professional gallery and stage lighting contribute greatly to the gallery's ambience and high-quality presentation and an outstanding guest experience.

An electrical contractor, Sooke Harbour Electric, is hired to obtain the permits and connect the electrical panel, and Paul Croy Stage Lighting Co. sets up stage lighting for the duration of the show. Both contractors offer considerable gift-in-kind reductions on their services (more than \$2000). The Sooke Fine Arts Show requests assistance in defraying \$1500 of the remainder of the total \$5600 in fees, supplies and permits needed for gallery lighting.

The Sooke Fine Arts Show increases community spirit and pride through the participation of 300 volunteers in producing a world-class art event in a small, rural community, It creates increased exposure and recognition for the Sooke region that fosters immediate and future economic development, with a spin-off effect estimated at more than \$500,000. It offers tremendous nation-wide and international marketing and promotional opportunities for artists within the CRD, and proven positive financial benefits for tourism, hospital and retail sectors in the region. After consistently delivering quality, family-friendly and accessible programming for three decades, the Show's long history and reputation have also allowed the Society to develop new, off-season programs to increase the availability of public art and arts-related events. youth programs and volunteer opportunities. These include an annual food & art benefit to raise funds for the Youth Art Scholarship and Sooke Food Bank; regular art events such as workshops and presentations, artist studio tours, and social activities to engage people with art in a friendly and relaxed setting. The Society has also begun a series of public murals for community beautification through collaboration between show artists and local students. All of these are a direct result of the show's impacts,
