1. CRISP Chair and Resources

- Three people were nominated to be Chair, two of them declined to stand. Carolyn selected by acclamation.
- CRISP members reaffirmed that CRISP needs a Coordinator, given how busy everyone is and the fact that the Chair cannot continue to take on Coordinator tasks.
- The Coordinator can be housed at the Coastal Invasive Species Committee (Coastal ISC).
- Todd is researching what the position might look like.
- Members agree that the Coordinator should be hired as a contractor, rather than a staff position: no payroll, less supervision, more flexibility. Coastal ISC also supports this approach.
- Funding TBD; perhaps by grants and/or pooling member resources. Some member agencies may be able to contribute money; others may be more able to contribute time.

2. Review of 2012/2013 CRISP pilot Regional Program

- \$15,400 received from BC MFLNRO
- Funds came unexpectedly, so CRISP needed to quickly define our program
- We developed a regional approach to managing priority invasive species, using knotweed as a pilot
- Accomplishments:

o Jurisdictional involvement

- Every jurisdiction except one provided a contact person for invasive species management
- Almost every jurisdiction committed to some kind of contribution to invasive species management (inventory, reporting, verification, treatment, pay for treatment, pick up cut knotweed, etc.)
- Knotweed treatments
 - Treated at a minimum of one location in every jurisdiction where it was reported
 - Reports vs. treatments: Rachelle and Carolyn will look up the information and report to CRISP
 - Bins were successful
 - Publications: format/templates developed, used for knotweed, can now be used for other species.
 - Knotweed BMPs
 - Knotweed Alert Sheet
 - EDRR Field Sheets
- Outreach and Education
 - CRISP web presence developed
 - Knotweed Alert sheet developed
 - Regional Eradicate field sheets developed
 - Regional Knotweed BMPs developed
 - Within the above documents: CRISP public image developed
 - Outline of Outreach and Education Strategy plus a workshop held

3. Plan for 2013 Regional Program

- There will be funds for CRISP work in the FLNRO grant to Coastal ISC again this year. Unclear at this point how much, but at least \$10,000. Rachelle to confirm the funding amount.
- Recommendations from members for this year's project:
 - Direction of last year's program was good.
 - o Bins are great. Last year, knotweed almost filled the 40-yard bin at Colwood.
 - Recommended species include: Continuing with knotweed, plus discussed adding additional species including knapweeds, Scotch thistle, blessed milk thistle, lesser celandine. However, early season species might be problematic due to funding cycles and challenges getting program up and running.
 - Add alert sheets for new species
 - Improve and update CRISP webspace

 Regional Program Advisory Committee will put together a proposal for this year's program.

6. Regional Disposal: Hartland update

- New bylaw has been approved.
- It would still be good to send a letter commending the revisions pertaining to invasive species (Todd's action item)

7. Coastal ISC update

- AGM and Forum June 13 in Nanaimo. This will include a session on CRISP as an example of a regional partnership.
- There will be a pesticide applicators course at the end of June exact date TBD.
 Anyone interested should contact Rachelle.
- Contractors have been hired for the season. Iverson Forest Management will cover the South Island. They will do inventory and treatment on lands owned/manged by the funding agencies, including MOTI, BC Hydro, MOF, Fortis, Pacheedaht; plus CRISP sites and some other priority ad hoc locations.
- Alison Millham has been hired back; working out of Courtenay.
- The local office of the Coastal ISC will be moving out of Rachelle's home and into the Swan Lake Operations building.

8. Invasive Plant Council of BC (ISCBC) update

- PlantWise programme will be rolled out next year. This is a pilot program addressing the nursery trade. It will include a certification program for the horticultural industry and a gardener awareness/outreach program.
- Fraser Valley, Metro Van, and Sea to Sky Regional Districts received money from the Real Estate Foundation for a program promoting the reporting of knotweed on properties/flagging this for potential buyers.
- ISCBC also received funding from the Real Estate Foundation to work with local governments throughout BC regarding invasive species bylaws and policies. It will likely include workshops throughout BC and have some connection with Real Estate agents.

9. Miscellaneous

 CRISP knotweed treatment training was requested last year for this season. Discussed interest/needs from jurisdictions present. This is currently flagged as an action item and Carolyn will send out an email on this possible training.
