

REPORT TO MAGIC LAKE ESTATES WATER AND SEWER LOCAL SERVICES COMMITTEE MEETING OF TUESDAY, MAY 12, 2015

SUBJECT WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE RENEWAL PROJECT - REFERENDUM AND NEXT STEPS UPDATE - MAY 2015

<u>ISSUE</u>

To provide an update on the Referendum process and the next steps required to advance the Magic Lakes Estates wastewater infrastructure renewal project.

BACKGROUND

Since the April 14, 2015 Magic Lake Estates Water and Sewer Local Services Committee meeting, the BC Inspector of Municipalities approved the Loan Authorization Bylaw. At the CRD Board meeting on May 13, 2015, a staff report request the appointment of the Chief Election Officer – Thomas F. Moore for the Referendum Vote on June 27.

In preparation for the June 6, 2015 Town Hall meeting, a draft PowerPoint presentation was developed, a copy of which will be provided at the meeting. Previously, the committee communicated the date of the Town Hall meeting in the community notice insert sent out with the April water bill. However, staff recommend a second Community Notice to communicate to the property owners the time and place of the meeting. A draft Community Notice is included in Appendix A.

<u>ALTERNATIVES</u>

Alternative 1

- 2. Approve a mail-out to communicate to the property owners of the time and place of the Town Hall meeting and approve funds from the Capital Reserves in the amount of \$800 for this purpose.

Alternative 2

That the Magic Lake Estates Water and Sewer Local Services Committee:

- 1. Request additional information from staff; and
- 2. Use alternative means to communicate to the property owners of the time and place of the Town Hall meeting.

IMPLICATIONS

Alternative 1 - The Referendum process for the proposed infrastructure replacement project is on schedule and preparations have been made for the Town Hall meeting. In our last Community Notice, we had not confirmed the time and place of the meeting and therefore, another community notice is required.

Alternative 2 - The committee requests additional information.

CONCLUSION

The Referendum process for the proposed infrastructure replacement project is on schedule as is preparation for the Town Hall meeting. Communication of the time and place of the Town Hall meeting is very important and there is likely no alternative but to do a mail-out.
