## Minutes of a Meeting of the Regional Housing Advisory Committee

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm.

### 1. Welcome and Introductions

Kevin Lorette welcomed all RHAC members and introductions were facilitated around the table.

### 2. Advisory Committee Role

Christine Culham provided a brief overview of the purpose of the RHAC as outlined in the RHAC Terms of Reference.

### 3. Orientation to Regional Housing

Christine Culham briefly reviewed the contents of the RHAC Orientation Packages and requested members to read them.

Christine Culham and John Reilly provided a brief introduction to CRD Regional Housing (pdf presentation attached).

### 4. Overview of Regional Housing Affordability Strategy (RHAS)

John Reilly provided an overview of the current RHAS and informed committee members that hard copies are available for those who are interested.

### 5. Roundtable – Sharing of priorities by each RHAC member

#### Summary of Priorities:

- Clearly defining 'affordability' and distinguishing from 'below market'
- Using a long-range lens on affordability when considering new developments
- Increasing density and housing diversity while still building livable communities
- Improving education for and engagement with communities regarding affordable housing to achieve community support for affordable housing projects
- Looking for innovative solutions for how to engage with and support developers: if municipalities want developers to create affordable housing, then municipalities also have to give something to developers in return (e.g. inclusionary housing policy)
- Balancing affordability desire with an understanding of market forces
- Addressing the challenges of limited land available within regions for development
- Addressing transit deficits and keeping housing growth in line with climate change issues

- Helping first time buyers achieve home ownership
- Identifying land to build supportive housing to help address the needs of people experiencing homelessness
- Coordinating access to affordable housing and, where necessary, supports
- Keeping Indigenous needs in focus
- Interested in studies on a) how municipal requirements affect housing costs, and b) planned housing projects and what they will be used for
- Addressing transportation impacts on location of affordable housing
- Aligning municipal expectations on affordability with provincial and federal requirements around affordability

## **6. Next Meeting**

- Chair selection will take place at the next meeting. Interested candidates should notify John Reilly by email and prepare a small presentation for the Committee next meeting after which committee members will vote to select the Chair and Vice-Chair.
- RHAC meetings will occur 5-6 times per year and ideally be scheduled the first Thursday of the month at 2:00 pm.
- Confidentiality forms have been distributed and committee members are expected to review and sign before the next meeting.
