

REPORT TO REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION MEETING OF WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2013

SUBJECT BYLAW NO. 3902 - REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY WATER WORKS FACILITIES LOAN AUTHORIZATION BYLAW

ISSUE

Access to funding for implementing the 2014-2018 Regional Water Supply five-year capital plan

BACKGROUND

Based on the 2014-2018 Regional Water Supply capital plan, borrowing of up to \$12.5 million will be required over the next five years to implement this plan. This borrowing will occur as required to meet cash flow needs for implementation of Commission-approved capital projects. Under the Local Government Act, participating area approval is required for the loan authorization and can be obtained through the Alternative Approval Process, which is the most time and cost efficient process.

ALTERNATIVES

- 1. That Bylaw No. 3902 cited as "Regional Water Supply Water Works Facilities Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 1, 2013" be introduced and read a first and second time, and read a third time;
- 2. That Bylaw No. 3902 be deferred to a future meeting pending further information.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The estimated debt servicing costs for the projected \$12.5 million borrowing are included in the 2014-2018 five-year capital plan budget. Typically a loan authorization is undertaken every five years. Any future changes to the capital plan will be accommodated within this loan authorization. Actual borrowings in each of the next five years will be based on the cash flow requirements for the year, subject to the availability of funds from consumption revenue (net of operating expenditures).

Currently, the total debt outstanding including the 2013 spring borrowing amounts to approximately \$90 million.

CONCLUSION

The 2014-2018 five-year capital works program is required to sustain the Regional Water Supply infrastructure. A loan authorization bylaw in the amount of \$12.5 million is required to access the funding needed.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Regional Water Supply Commission recommend to the CRD Board that Bylaw No. 3902, cited as "Regional Water Supply Water Works Facilities Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 1, 2013" be introduced and read a first and second time, and read a third time.

BYLAW NO. 3902

A BYLAW TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF TWELVE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$12,500,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, DESIGNING AND CONSTRUCTING WATER WORKS FACILITIES OF REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY

WHEREAS:

- A. Under Bylaw No. 2537. "Water Supply Local Service Area Establishment Bylaw No. 1, 1997", and as amended by subsequent bylaws, the Board of the Regional District established a local service for the purpose of supplying water in the Regional District;
- B. The Board of the Capital Regional District may, by bylaw, borrow money for capital purposes in designing and constructing water works facilities in the Regional District;
- C. The estimated cost of acquiring land, designing and constructing the water works facilities including expenses incidental thereto, is the sum of Twelve Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$12,500,000) which is the amount of debt intended to be authorized by this bylaw;
- D. The Board of the Capital Regional District has by resolution passed by at least 2/3 of the votes cast, permitted assent of the electors to be given in the entire proposed service area pursuant to section 801of the *Local Government Act*;
- E. The approval of the Inspector of Municipalities is required under section 819 of the Local Government Act;
- F. Pursuant to Section 801.3 of the *Local Government Act*, participating area approval for the entire service area shall be obtained by alternative approval process;
- G. It is proposed that the financing of the said facilities is to be undertaken by the Municipal Finance Authority of British Columbia pursuant to proposed agreements between that Authority and the Capital Regional District.

NOW THEREFORE the Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

 The Board is hereby empowered and authorized to undertake and carry out or cause to be carried out the acquisition of land, planning, study, design and construction of buildings, plant, mains, dams, and other water works facilities and equipment herein before described and to do all things necessary in connection therewith and without limiting the generality of the foregoing:

- a) to borrow upon the credit of the Regional District a sum not exceeding Twelve Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$12,500,000);
- b) to acquire all such real property, easements, rights-of-way, leases, licenses, rights or authorities as may be requisite or desirable for or in connection with the acquisition of land, planning, study, design and construction to add, replace, upgrade water works facilities and all related ancillary works, studies and equipment deemed necessary by the Board.
- 2. The maximum term for which debentures may be issued to secure the debt intended to be created by this bylaw is 15 years.
- 3. This Bylaw may be cited as "Regional Water Supply Water Works Facilities Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 1, 2013".
