3.1 Janet Clouston - Chamber of Commerce, re: Tourism Marketing

Ms Clouston provided an overview and electronic presentation of marketing efforts which promote the Southern Gulf Islands equally in attracting visitors for the shoulder season. A request for funding will be considered later in the meeting.

3.2 Kisae Peterson- Salt Spring Housing Council

Ms. Peterson provided an update on the status of affordable housing projects which are in process for the Island.

- Currently over 200 units waiting for approval from Islands Trust to proceed.
- As in many areas in BC, the lack of long term affordable housing has reached a crises point and is effecting all sectors of the community. (example: service, health and trades)
- A strategy for affordable housing has been in the works for many years under the SSI Community Affordable Housing Strategy (CAHS).
- The Croftonbrook development is in jeopardy of losing grant funding if the land use process continues to delay the project.

- Requesting support from CEDC to pressure Islands Trust and Ganges Sewer into prioritizing affordable housing projects and progressing land use applications
- Commission will address under Item 6.4

5.1 Fee for Service Agreement- Tourism Marketing

6. New Business

6.1 CEDC Strategic Plan Update

Received a \$9800 grant from Rural Dividend program to conduct an alternative
business services model feasibility study.

MOVED by Commissioner Carlin, **SECONDED** by Commissioner MacDonald, Whereas the CEDC will be developing an updated strategic framework that will offer advice, evidence-based research, options and insights about current and projected economic trends that are related to Salt Spring Island's economy.

Whereas during the March 15, 2018, CEDC public meeting a motion was passed for SSI-CRD staff to seek proposals for an updated CEDC economic strategic framework. This RFP is supported in the 2018 CEDC budget.

Therefore, be it resolved that the Updated CEDC Strategic Framework proposal be funded up to a maximum of \$25,000.00.

6.2 CRD – SSI Commissioner Collaboration

6.2.1 - Summer Saturday Parking Shuttle

Robin Williams, Chair of Transportation Commission spoke to this topic:

- Seeking collaboration between Commissions; sharing of common purposes
- Transition Salt Spring may apply for a grant in aid to fund a summer Saturday bus shuttle service
- Establish a budget; hire coordinator and driver
- School bus not insured over summer months; consider PARC summer bus which is not used on Saturday's
- Pilot project to ease parking congestion

MOVED by Commissioner Carlin, **SECONDED** by Commissioner MacDonald, That the Salt Spring Island Community Economic Commission supports Transition Salt Spring in an application for a Capital Regional District Grant in Aid to facilitate a pilot shuttle bus service on summer Saturdays to ease parking congestion during the Market in the Park high season.

6.2.2 - SSI Harbour Docks

Chair Carlin lead the discussion

- Topic was brought forward from a joint meeting of local CRD Commission Chairs
- Marinas should be inviting ports of call; Reflect overall island needs
- Broaden visitor accommodations and facilities
- Feasibility study to look for missed commerce opportunities

MOVED by Commissioner Patrick, **SECONDED** by Commissioner MacDonald, That the CEDC recommends the CRD consider the feasibility of acquiring the management and operations of the Salt Spring Island docks at the expiry of the term of the operating agreement between the Harbour Authority Salt Spring Island and Department of Fisheries and Oceans.

6.3 Red Tape Reduction Opportunity

- develop short infographic
- add to the Opportunity Salt Spring Website
- effort to assist and attract entrepreneurs who may have interest in the land use development process

MOVED by Commissioner MacDonald, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Harkley, Whereas the CEDC has noticed that commercial development is a difficult process to navigate, we propose a civic education piece be developed, with input and support from Islands Trust and CRD staff, that would explain the process and hosted on Opportunity Salt Spring. This might be a short, animated video, an “infographic” or other medium to support entrepreneurs appropriately navigate the development process.

That an educational infographic be created to guide entrepreneurs on the Salt Spring Island development process with a budget of up to \$5,000.

6.4 Affordable Housing Support Letters

 - owner plans to stay within current zoning allotment
 - planning a neighbourhood engagement session
 - enhance community feeling

- mix of commercial, lodging and environmental education (salmon enhancement)
- Working with BC ferries on economic issues; shipping, fuel costs, visitor impressions
- Workforce/Affordable Housing Crisis
 - Not unique situation in BC
 - Rural status supported by Islands Trust Council; could open up funding sources
 - Regional housing focus is on urban settings
 - Water hook ups is poor excuse to stop affordable housing projects; people are already here and using utilities from substandard living situations
 - Consider farm village community housing; 20 to 40 age group, seeking safe healthy lifestyle
 - Need to change mind of nimby's
 - Creative thinking and pairing of stakeholders to educate community on needs of working families; education is part of solution
 - Island population has capacity; need balance between environment and humanity; economy growth has limits; slow down tourism and seek year round economic opportunities
