The inaugural meeting was called to order at 4:00 pm by the Senior Manager.

1. Election of Chair and Vice-Chair

Nominations for Chair of the Transportation Commission were called for by the Senior Manager.

Director McIntyre nominated Robin Williams for the position of chair. Additional nominations were called for three times with no further comment and Robin Williams accepted the position of Chair.

Chair Williams called for nominations for the position of Vice-Chair. Commissioner Denyer was nominated. Additional nominations were called for three times with no further comment and Nigel Denyer accepted the position of Vice- Chair.

2. Approval of Agenda

MOVED by Director McIntyre, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Martens, That the Salt Spring Island Transportation Commission agenda of January 29, 2018 be approved.

3. Adoption of Minutes of November 27, 2017

MOVED by Commissioner Barrett, **SECONDED** by Director McIntyre, That the Salt Spring Island Transportation Commission Minutes of November 27, 2017 be approved.

4. Delegation/Presentation

4.1 Tina Rogers, Road Area Manager, re: Overview of Annual Maintenance Contract Ms. Rogers did not attend meeting.

4.2 Jeremy Milsom, Chamber VP and Communications Chair, re: Survey results regarding the closure of Fulford Ganges Road near the Fire Hall and Centennial Park.

In 2017 the Chamber was asked by the Transportation Commission to seek input from the community on expanding the Saturday Market onto Fulford Ganges Road in front of Centennial Park.

The Chamber surveyed many stakeholders within the downtown area along with their members. The downtown business area is not in favor, many of these businesses are Chamber Members. Suggested alternative locations: Farmers Institute, School District Property or Rotary Park.

5. Director, Chair and Commissioner Reports

- **5.1** Director McIntyre briefly reported on:
 - CRD Committee Appointments; Director McIntyre is the Chair of Electoral Area Service Committee (EASC) and will focus on bringing more visibility to Salt Spring (example: Rural Accelerator Presentation); As Vice Chair of the Transportation Committee focus will be on ferries, rail and transit linkage with Vancouver Island.
 - Rural Status continued efforts and gaining support for the three Electoral Areas to be designated Rural.
 - Burgoyne Bay Liquid Waste Facility- Receiving and storage tanks replaced. Project under budget and completed early. New volunteers appointed to re-establish commission.
 - Volunteer Appreciation Event- gathering of volunteers from throughout the community whom partner with and further the efforts of CRD projects.
- **5.2** Chair Williams briefly reported on:
 - Salt Spring Island Commission appointments and working relations; Gregg Dow as Chair for Parks and Recreation; Francine Carlin as Chair of the Economic Development Commission.
 - Bus shelter working group; Commissioner Brickenden will participate.
 - SSI Transit is in its eighth year.

6. Outstanding Business

6.1 Gulf Islands Regional Trail Plan Changes for Salt Spring

Chair Williams shared correspondence with Regional Parks Staff:

- Trail route is Vesuvius Ferry terminal to Fulford Ferry terminal.
- Plan is conceptual; initial section to be built by Regional Parks will be the 5 km between Vesuvius Ferry Terminal and Atkins Road.
- Plan now reflects wording regarding local groups and the coordination of efforts for various sections of trail development.

6.2 North Ganges Transportation Plan Update

Senior Manager Campbell reported:

- JE Anderson has provided final drawings to Ministry of Transportation (MoTI).
- Friday February 2, 2018- Meeting with MoTI/JE Anderson/CRD Staff.
- Any changes requested will be brought forward to the Commission in point form.
- Tender package and construction timeline will be determined by the outcome of the Friday meeting.

6.3 Intersection of Upper and Lower Ganges

Chair Williams brought topic forward for discussion:

- MoTI considers the safety improvement at this intersection to be a stop light;
 negotiate with MoTI for joint funding on improvement project.
- Reintroduce concept of a "round a about" at intersection; some land acquisition needed to accommodate design.
- Ask community to prioritize projects; intersection safety or Ganges Hill; funding through referendum.
- Community acquisition of the private property at end of harbour on corner of intersection referred to as the "Brown House"
 - o Potential link to boardwalk project, PARC improvements are focused on "Pecks Cove Park"
 - o Allow space for "a round a about" improvement
 - Opportunity for 1st Nations Cultural Centre and preservation of historical area; potential funding source partner
 - o Provide public access to entire harbour

6.4 Pull-Out Adjacent Embe Bakery

- \$10,000 estimation on obtaining formal design work for a bus stop pull out
- Staff recommendation is to consider entire road area and include with the improvements to Ganges Hill

7. New Business

7.1 Land Referrals-Dragonfly Commons-221 Drake Road

Brief discussion:

- Several affordable housing projects identified and in progress for this area of the Island; suitable for walking distance to town and amenities.
- Drake road already services a dense area that has a mixed neighbourhood of private residences, Lions Community Hall, a Church property, Schools and access to Mouat Park.
- Entire road is already substandard for the volume of development and zoning in place; narrow sections.
- Discussion around who has the responsibility to pay for the entire road infrastructure and intersection safety improvements; Island Trust land use and zoning, MoTI subdivision approval, developer amenity charges, CRD Transportation.
- The Commission does not want to see the cost born by an affordable housing developer for the scope of work needed to improve Drake Road.

A) Ministry of Transportation-File 2017-06898 Subdivision Application, re: 221 Drake Road

MOVED by Commissioner Martens, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Denyer, That the Salt Spring Island Transportation Commission supports affordable housing developments in the area with the reservation that Drake Road is substandard; further a request is made that Islands Trust require that the Ministry of Transportation prioritize improvements to Drake Road in its entirety, including the intersection of Drake Road and Ganges Hill without expense to the developers.

B) Islands Trust Bylaw Referral 504 and 505, re: 221 Drake Road, Dragon Fly Commons Rezoning

MOVED by Commissioner Martens, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Denyer, That the Salt Spring Island Transportation Commission supports affordable housing developments in the area with the reservation that Drake Road is substandard; further a request is made that Islands Trust require that the Ministry of Transportation prioritize improvements to Drake Road in its entirety, including the intersection of Drake Road and Ganges Hill without expense to the developers.

7.2 Islands Trust Bylaw Referral 508, re: 121 Upper Ganges Road, Harbour House Rezoning

Brief discussion:

- Significant upgrades to hotel and amenities; including charger spaces for cars and bikes.
- Dangerous location to cross over to the harbour side of the road
- Desire would be to direct hotel's pedestrian traffic directly to the corner of Upper and Lower Ganges which will eventually be connected to upland pathway system into town.
- Trail sections or right of ways already in place along sides of development
- Harbour house already considering a pathway fronting property; however slope and sensitive archeologic area will be determined route
- Transportation Commission cannot directly request or receive funding from subdivision or rezoning applications.

MOVED by Commissioner Denyer, SECONDED by Commissioner Martens,

That the Salt Spring Island Transportation Commission supports the request made by the Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission that the developer provide a public pathway which further connects the trails and pathway system to the intersection of Upper and Lower Ganges Road.

7.3 Special trip bus approvals: Lions, Christmas Dinners and Islands Trust Council

Chair Williams requested retroactive permission for some events which already occurred over the holidays, and those upcoming. The Transportation Commission is in favour of supporting special use requests for the local transit service and receiving annual reports outlining the usage.

MOVED by Commissioner Brickenden, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Barrett, That the Salt Spring Island Transportation Commission provides a blanket acceptance for any approved applicants for a special use charter bus service at cost recovery rates determined by BC Transit.
