# 6. STAFF REPORTS

# a) Staff News

#### Events:

The SEAPARC Manager reported on the Sooke Bike Park and Hike & Bike Connector Trail Grand Opening held March 28, 2015 which saw over 200 people attending under sunny skies. Dignitaries included Mayor Tait, Director Hicks, John Horgan (MLA), CRD Board Chair Nils Jensen and T'Sou-ke Nation elder Shirley Alphonse. The Manager thanked all the staff and volunteers involved in the project with particular recognition paid to Darcy Smith, Recreation Program Assistant, for her work both on the Bike Park Steering Committee and as organizer of the event.

# Programs:

# Aquatics:

There are 171 grade 2 students currently taking part in the Red Cross swim lessons, sponsored by the Lions Club. An inflatable dragon slide recently purchased from Peninsula Recreation is being readied for use by the end of April.

#### Arena:

The final Coast Capital Free Skate was held March 10<sup>th</sup>, with over 50 people in attendance.

#### Fitness:

Registered fitness classes continue to show a growth in participation, most recently with the Easy Fit program which is full with a waitlist. This program supports those with limited mobility and/or returning from an injury or surgery to participate in a modified fitness program.

#### Recreation:

SEAPARC assisted a local parent, Debbie Holmes, to host free youth activities during Spring Break including a card game night, and a Skate Jam on Sat March 7, which had 42 competitors and over 200 spectators throughout the day.

SEAPARC is creating a pilot program which will be implemented this summer called "Play in the Parks". This program will be free to attend, and will take place Monday to Thursday through July and August. The goal of this program is to engage children who might not be able to afford traditional summer program options in recreation and physical activities in their community, in a safe, positive and active environment. Currently, we are seeking community sponsorship to support the program to ensure its success and minimize costs. Sooke Rotary Club has donated \$500 to purchase equipment.

Staff will not be proceeding with an application for the BC Childcare Major Capital Funding grant to expand the preschool space. This is due to the time constraints and scope of project compared to what the grant allows for in the funding criteria.

SEAPARC will introduce a summer auxiliary Skate Park Host/Leader position in 2015 who will help create a safe, fun place for people of all ages to enjoy the Skate Park. This position will connect and engage with youth by facilitating skill development, acting as a mentor to the youth and a liaison between the public and SEAPARC, in addition to providing some general supervision of park use. This is a positive step towards connecting with youth who might not normally access SEAPARC programs. The budget allocated to teen program wages will support this position.

# Ice Allocation Meeting

The 2015/16 Ice Allocation Meeting will be held at 7pm on May 12, 2015 in the SEAPARC Board Room. Commissioner Berger and Bishop will represent the Commission at the meeting.

# Ice Out Date 2016

School District 62 announced that the 2016 Spring Break will run from Mar. 12-30, 2016. The last day of SEAPARC ice availability is scheduled for March 20, 2016. This will allow staff time to remove ice and prepare the dry floor for the annual Easter Extravaganza event.

## Power Pole Replacement

A wooden power pole located at the back the facility on SEAPARC property is in urgent need of replacement due to its deteriorating condition. Estimated cost to replace the pole is approximately \$8,000-8,500. During installation, power to the arena will be interrupted for up eight hours while three transformers are moved to the new pole.

**MOVED** by Commissioner Perkins, **SECONDED** by Director Tait that the funds necessary to replace a wooden power pole on SEAPARC property be transferred from the Capital Reserve Fund.

# **LED Lighting**

The two bids received in response to the "Request for Quotes" for installation of LED lighting were higher than anticipated. Given the tight timeline involved in scheduling installation during ice out and pool shutdown, installation may need to be delayed until 2016. Staff will prepare a revised "Request for Quotes".

# Artificial Turf Playing Field Grant Application

The SEAPARC Manager updated the Commission on the status of the Federal Gas Tax Fund Strategic Priorities Fund grant application. The proposed artificial turf playing field design will accommodate soccer, football, rugby and baseball.

# 3. NEW BUSINESS

The SEAPARC Manager reported on the recent failure of two heat recovery tanks that utilize heat from the arena's ammonia system and recommended replacement of the tanks. Upon Commission query, the Manager noted that the lifespan of the new tanks will be approximately 15 years and that there will be a 3 1/2 year return on investment and approximately \$950 in cost savings per month.

**MOVED** by Commissioner Perkins, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Bishop that \$20,000 be accessed from the Equipment Replacement Fund for the purchase and installation of new heat recovery tanks, including associated piping and valves, to replace the existing tanks which have failed.

The SEAPARC Manager outlined steps being taken to address repairs/remediation of the Sooke Skate Park including meetings on site with concrete resurfacing companies and discussions with resident Debbie Holmes. The Manager would like work to begin as soon as possible to address cracks and erosion. Work is expected to take approximately one week and cost \$10,000-\$15,000.

**MOVED** by Commissioner Grove, **SECONDED** by Commissioner Bishop that \$15,000 be accessed from the Capital Reserve Fund to initiate immediate remediation of the Sooke Skate Park.
