### Summary

The Southern Gulf Island (SGI) Emergency Program (EP) supports local communities within the SGI Electoral Area. The Emergency Management Lead (EML) facilitates the SGIEP on behalf of Capital Regional District (CRD) Protective Services, managing day-to-day program business and providing direction on training, risk mitigation, planning, emergency response and recovery.

The contractor will be responsible for coordination of the SGIEP, ensuring alignment with CRD emergency plans and developing community relationships with key stakeholders.

This position is ideal for people who are seeking to apply their previous emergency management training and experience to SGI.

### Program Objectives

- Ensure coverage of SGIEP Duty Officer with assistance from EP Deputies.
- Act as Director for the SGI Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) during a disaster or emergency event.
- Oversee volunteer coordinators of Emergency Social Services (ESS) and the Neighbourhood Program.
- Facilitate community-based activities such as training, planning, and/or ESS exercises.
- Perform regular reviews of the SGI Emergency Plan, ensuring it is up-to-date and aligned with CRD emergency plans.
- Assist with emergency management in other CRD Electoral Areas when required.
- Provide program updates to the CRD Emergency Manager or designate.

### Competencies

- Emergency management training in the areas of preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery
- Familiarity with pager and basic radio operations
- Proficiency with basic computer and email functions
- Must reside in the Southern Gulf Islands
- Ability to work at various times; including weekdays, weekends, holidays, and evenings
