

How the CRD Works

The business of the CRD Board is managed by 24 directors who are elected every four years from 13 municipalities and three electoral areas. CRD Board meetings are held monthly on the second Wednesday at 625 Fisgard Street, Victoria, and are open to the public.

Services provided by the CRD in whole or part to portions of the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area include:

- Water, bylaw enforcement, animal control, regional parks, emergency response, blue box recycling, landfill, and regional library etc.

Capital Regional Hospital District (CRHD)

The CRHD shares costs with Island Health. The Health Facilities & Capital Planning Strategies Division reviews Island Health's proposed major capital projects and recommends projects for CRHD Board consideration.

The CRHD also provides funding annually for minor health infrastructure improvements and for medical equipment. The Division undertakes various health facility & community health policy and research initiatives, and administers the Local Board of Health function.

How is the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Governed?

Elections for the Regional Director and six members of the Land Use Committee are held every four years. The Regional Director is the area's representative at the CRD Board and on various CRD committees. Commissions in the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area are:

- Fire Commissions
- Emergency Preparedness Commissions, Search and Rescue
- Land Use Committee
- Juan de Fuca Parks Commission

Ad hoc committees are appointed by the Electoral Area Director on a case by case scenario.

Current Governance in the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area

The province is divided into 28 Regional Districts. The CRD is one of these Regional Districts. The CRD Board is comprised of appointed members of municipalities and elected Regional Directors from unincorporated areas.

Regional districts have three basic roles. First, regional districts provide regional governance and services for the region as a whole. They provide a political forum for representation of regional residents and communities, and a vehicle for advancing the interests of the region as a whole.

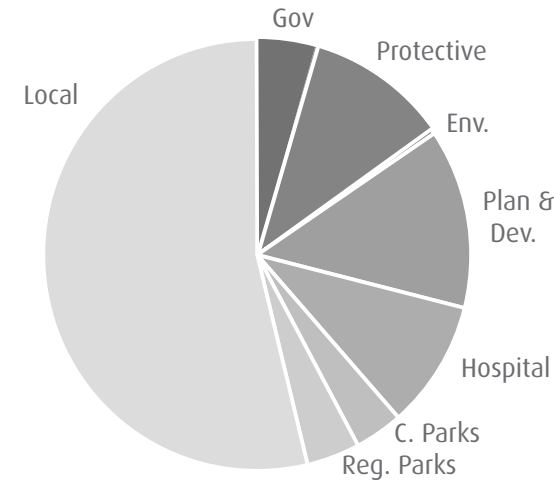
They provide a vehicle for the delivery of typical region-wide services like economic development, water supply, and solid waste management.

Second, regional districts provide a political and administrative framework for inter-municipal or sub-regional service partnerships through the creation of "benefiting areas".

Third, regional districts are, in the absence of municipalities, the local government for rural areas. At the very least, this means that the regional district provides community planning and land use regulation in rural areas.

Juan de Fuca Electoral Area 2020 Requisition

The total requisition is \$5,203,136 (2019 \$5,026,834).
