To all interested parties;

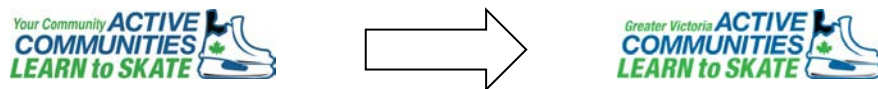
