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CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

BYLAW NO. 2338

A BYLAW FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A TIPPING FEE AND REGULATIONS FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AT HARTLAND LANDFILL

WHEREAS by Supplementary Letters Patent, dated 04 October 1973, the Capital Regional District was granted the function of Refuse Disposal under Division X of its Letters Patent;

AND WHEREAS the Capital Regional District has by bylaw, converted the function of solid waste disposal to a local service for all of the Regional District;

AND WHEREAS the Capital Regional District is empowered to establish a scale of charges payable for depositing refuse at a disposal site;

AND WHEREAS the Regional Board of the Capital Regional District deems it advisable to enact regulations pertaining to solid waste disposal and to establish a charge for depositing refuse;

NOW THEREFORE the Regional Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1 - DEFINITIONS

In this Bylaw unless the context otherwise requires:

"ACTIVE FACE" means that area of the DISPOSAL SITE which is currently involved in actively landfilling SOLID WASTE.

"AGGREGATE" means reusable or recyclable inert granular construction fill material.

"ASBESTOS CEMENT" means shingles, tiles, siding, board or pipe containing asbestos material tightly bound within a solid matrix not easily crumbled by hand but which is easily crumbled and friable by equipment during landfill disposal.

"ASPHALT" means recyclable asphaltic concrete originating from roadways, driveways, parking areas and other paved surfaces.

"BULKY WASTE" means metal containers or other manufactured articles with a volume greater than one and a half (1.5) cubic metres and timbers greater than two and a half (2.5) metres in length.

"CAPITAL REGION" means the Capital Regional District.

"CERTIFIED STERILIZATION FACILITY" means a sterilizing (autoclaving) facility which complies with all CSA requirements, CCME Draft Code of Practice June 1991, and is approved by the ENGINEER and which meets the minimum standards to ensure biomedical waste is sterilized.

"CLEAN SOIL" means clean fill material.

"CONCRETE" means a hardened recyclable mixture of cement with sand and gravel.

"CONTROLLED WASTE" means certain HAZARDOUS WASTE, liquid waste and REFUSE which is approved for disposal at the DISPOSAL SITE but which, because of its inherent nature and quantity, may require special handling and disposal techniques to avoid creating health hazards, nuisances or environmental pollution, including, but not limited to:

- (a) water containing soil, sand, gravel, other non-hazardous solids, sewage solids, trace levels
 of petroleum products or grease, including:
 - (i) pumpings from parking lot drainage sumps
 - (ii) pumpings from domestic and municipal sewage treatment plants and sand filters and pump stations
 - (iii) pumpings from domestic septic tanks
 - (iv) pumpings from laundry lint traps
 - (v) pumpings from sumps which collect runoff from vehicle washing facilities only, but not from facilities used for maintenance or lubrication of automobile components or where solvents or sandblasting are employed for removal of paint, grease or oil
 - (vi) spent charcoal from water purification plants
- (b) screenings from municipal sewage treatment plants and pump stations
- (c) waste sludge from municipal sewage treatment plants and pump stations
- (d) condemned foods
- (e) food processing wastes
- (f) DEAD ANIMALS
- (g) BULKY WASTE
- (h) SHARPS received from CERTIFIED STERILIZATION FACILITIES
- (i) WASTE ASBESTOS
- SOURCE-SEPARATED GYPSUM BOARD OR WALLBOARD in loads weighing less than 100 kilograms.
- (k) ASBESTOS CEMENT
- (I) SOOT

"CORRUGATED CARDBOARD" means RECYCLABLE WASTE, including, but not limited to, containers or materials used in containers consisting of three or more layers of kraft paper materials and having smooth exterior liners and a corrugated or rippled core, but excluding containers which are impregnated with blood, grease, oil, chemicals, food residue, wax; or have polyethylene, polystyrene, foil or other non-paper liners; or are contaminated with a material which will render the CORRUGATED CARDBOARD not MARKETABLE.

"COVERED SOLID WASTE" means a load of REFUSE secured and covered on the VEHICLE so that it cannot blow or fall off while in transit.

"DEAD ANIMALS," including parts of animals, equal to or greater than five kilograms in weight.

"DESIGNATED DUMPING AREA" means designated areas at the DISPOSAL SITE where active landfilling is taking place.

"<u>DIRECTORIES</u>" means paper books containing, but not limited to, alphabetical or classified lists by name, address, telephone number or location, which are used and distributed primarily by telephone companies and real estate boards.

"DISPOSAL SITE" means Hartland Landfill site, more particularly described in Appendix "1" attached hereto.

"ENGINEER" means the Chief Engineer of the CAPITAL REGION or his authorized agent.

"GYPSUM BOARD OR WALLBOARD," including, but not necessarily limited to, new construction offcuts or scraps and old wallboard that has been painted, covered in wallpaper, vinyl or ceramic tiles and which is removed during renovation, but excluding wallboard from demolition sites or wallboard associated with asbestos "HAZARDOUS WASTE" means gaseous, liquid and SOLID WASTE which, because of its inherent nature and quantity, requires special disposal techniques to avoid creating health hazards, nuisances or environmental pollution. HAZARDOUS WASTES are toxins or poisons, corrosives, irritants, strong sensitizers, flammables, explosives, infectious wastes, condemned foods, etc. Flammable wastes exclude plastics, paper, paper products and the like.

"IGNITABLE" means having the properties of:

- (a) flammable gas;
- (b) flammable liquid; or
- (c) flammable solids, substances liable to spontaneous combustion or substances that on contact with water emit flammable gases

as defined in the SPECIAL WASTE REGULATION.

"LEAD ACID BATTERY" means an electro-chemical cell contained in a plastic case consisting of lead and lead oxide plates and containing a mixture of acids which is used to supply an electric power source for motor vehicles.

"LOADS" means that SOLID WASTE which arrives at the DISPOSAL SITE in a VEHICLE.

"MARKETABLE" means materials which can be disposed of through existing CAPITAL REGION programs or for which a commercial market exists.

"PROCESSED YARD AND GARDEN WASTE" means organic, SOURCE-SEPARATED WASTE, including, but not necessarily limited to, grass, lawn and hedge clippings, grass sod, flowers, weeds, leaves, vegetable stalks, shrubs, and shrub and tree branches which have been chipped to less than 50 mm in any dimension.

"PROHIBITED WASTE" means gaseous, liquid and SOLID WASTE not acceptable for landfilling at the DISPOSAL SITE, including, but not limited to:

- (a) liquids, except as permitted in this Bylaw
- (b) empty waste containers, unless they are crushed, shredded or similarly reduced in volume to the maximum practical extent
- (c) IGNITABLE WASTES
- (d) REACTIVE WASTES
- (e) RADIOACTIVE WASTE
- (f) HAZARDOUS WASTE, except as permitted in this Bylaw
- (g) motor vehicle bodies and farm implements
- (h) SPECIAL WASTE, excluding WASTE ASBESTOS, STERILIZED BIOMEDICAL WASTE and SOURCE-SEPARATED GYPSUM BOARD OR WALLBOARD in loads weighing less than 100 kilograms
- (i) REFUSE that is on fire or smouldering

"PROPANE TANK" means a refillable or non-refillable metal container rated at a capacity of less than 46 kilograms (100 lbs) which is used to contain flammable hydrocarbon gases used as fuel.

"RADIOACTIVE WASTE" means waste containing a prescribed substance as defined in the Atomic Energy Control Act (Canada) in sufficient quantity or concentration to require a licence for possession or use under that Act and regulations made under that Act.

"REACTIVE" means waste which is:

- (a) explosive, oxidizing or so unstable that it readily undergoes violent change in the presence of air or water;
- (b) generates toxic gases, vapours or fumes by itself or when mixed with water; or
- (c) polymerized in whole or in part by chemical action and causes damage by generating heat or increasing in volume;

as defined in the SPECIAL WASTE REGULATION.

"RECYCLABLE WASTE" means MARKETABLE, SOURCE-SEPARATED WASTE, including, but not necessarily limited to, newspaper, ledger and computer paper, mixed waste paper, magazines, DIRECTORIES, CORRUGATED CARDBOARD, boxboard, plastic food and beverage containers, WHITE GOODS, glass food and beverage containers, LEAD ACID BATTERIES, SOURCE-SEPARATED GYPSUM BOARD OR WALLBOARD, PROPANE TANKS, TIRES, USED OIL FILTERS, AGGREGATE, CONCRETE, RUBBLE, CLEAN SOIL, SCRAP METAL and ASPHALT.

"RECYCLING AREA" means that area of the DISPOSAL SITE which has been posted to receive RECYCLABLE WASTE.

"REFUSE," including, but not necessarily limited to, UNMARKETABLE food wastes; market wastes such as fruit and vegetables; combustibles such as leather, wood and paper; noncombustibles such as crockery, glass, dirt; ashes from fireplaces and on-site incinerators; street sweepings; BULKY WASTES such as furniture and stumps; construction and demolition refuse such as non-metal pipe, plastics and lumber; all arising from domestic, commercial, institutional or municipal activities, but not including refuse resulting from industrial operations.

"REGIONAL BOARD" means the Board of the Capital Regional District.

"RESTRICTED WASTE" means RECYCLABLE WASTE not acceptable for landfilling at the DISPOSAL SITE, including, but not limited to:

- (a) AGGREGATE
- (b) ASPHALT
- (c) CLEAN SOIL
- (d) CONCRETE
- (e) CORRUGATED CARDBOARD (excluding CORRUGATED CARDBOARD received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS)
- (f) DIRECTORIES (excluding DIRECTORIES received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS)
- (g) LEAD ACID BATTERIES (excluding LEAD ACID BATTERIES received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS in household quantities of two or less)
- (h) PROPANE TANKS (excluding PROPANE TANKS received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS in household quantities of two or less)
- (i) RUBBLE
- (j) SCRAP METAL (excluding SCRAP METAL received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS)
- (k) TIRES with or without rims (excluding TIRES received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS in household quantities of five or less)
- (I) USED OIL FILTERS (excluding USED OIL FILTERS received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS in household quantities of five or less)
- (m) WHITE GOODS (excluding WHITE GOODS received at the RECYCLING AREA in SMALL LOADS in household quantities of two or less)

"RUBBLE" means a recyclable mixture of gravel, brick, concrete block, road asphalt and rock originating from demolition or construction sites.

"SCRAP METAL" means recyclable ferrous and non-ferrous metallic materials, including, but not limited to, sheet metal, siding, roofing, rebar, flashings, pipes, window frames, doors, furnaces, duct work, wire, cable, bathtubs, fencing, bicycle frames, automotive body parts, machinery, garbage cans, metal furniture, tire rims.

"SHARPS" means clinical and laboratory materials consisting of needles, syringes, blades or laboratory glass.

"SITE REGULATIONS" means regulations as described in Schedule "A" attached hereto, which must be adhered to by any person using the DISPOSAL SITE.

"SMALL LOAD" means SOLID WASTE that arrives at the DISPOSAL SITE in a VEHICLE having a maximum Gross Vehicle Weight of 5500 kilograms.

"SOLID WASTE" means REFUSE, RECYCLABLE WASTE, YARD AND GARDEN WASTE and CONTROLLED WASTE suitable for disposal at the DISPOSAL SITE but excluding PROHIBITED WASTE.

"SOOT" means black carbonaceous residue of wood, coal, oil and other fossil fuels originating in chimney linings, boilers, furnaces and other burners.

"SOURCE-SEPARATED WASTE" means SOLID WASTE that arrives at the DISPOSAL SITE and which is separated by means of barriers or placement in containers into clearly distinguishable accumulations of RECYCLABLE WASTE, YARD AND GARDEN WASTE, REFUSE and CONTROLLED WASTE, as applicable.

"SPECIAL WASTE" means any chemical compound, mixture, substance or article which is defined as such in the SPECIAL WASTE REGULATION.

"SPECIAL WASTE REGULATION" means BC Regulation 631/88 under the Waste Management Act (British Columbia).

"STERILIZATION" means a process by which all microorganisms including bacteria, viruses, spores and fungi are killed.

"STERILIZED BIOMEDICAL WASTE" means non-anatomical waste which is generated by, but not limited to, the following:

- (a) hospitals
- (b) laboratories
- (c) doctors' offices
- (d) clinics
- (e) veterinarians

and which has been sterilized, and clearly identified as being sterilized, in a CERTIFIED STERILIZATION FACILITY and as defined in the CCME Draft Code of Practice for the Management of Biomedical Waste in Canada (June 1991).

"TIRES" means the outer pneumatic rubber covering of wheels of passenger vehicles, light service trucks and motorcycles with an inner diameter of less than 42 centimetres.

"TREASURER" means the Director of Finance of the CAPITAL REGION or her or his authorized agent.

"UNMARKETABLE" means materials which cannot be disposed of through existing CAPITAL REGION recycling programs.

"<u>USED OIL FILTER</u>" means a spent cylindrical metal container housing a filter element which is used on a motor vehicle to remove impurities from its engine lubricating oil.

"VEHICLE" means a vehicle, as defined in the Motor Vehicle Act of BC.

"VISITOR" means a person who arrives at the DISPOSAL SITE for purposes other than to deposit SOLID WASTE.

"WHITE GOODS" means metal appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, clothes washers, dishwashers, clothes dryers, ranges, stoves, air conditioners and hot water tanks.

"WASTE ASBESTOS" means waste containing friable asbestos fibres or asbestos dust as defined in the SPECIAL WASTE REGULATION.

"YARD AND GARDEN WASTE" means organic, SOURCE-SEPARATED WASTE, including, but not necessarily limited to, grass, lawn and hedge clippings, grass sod, flowers, weeks, leaves, vegetable stalks, shrubs, and shrub and tree branches less than 75 mm (3 inches) in diameter.

SECTION 2 - CONDITIONS

- (a) No person shall deposit SOLID WASTE which does not originate from within the CAPITAL REGION at the DISPOSAL SITE.
- (b) No person shall, in depositing SOLID WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE:
 - deposit SOLID WASTE except as directed by regulations for the use of the DISPOSAL SITE;
 - deposit SOLID WASTE without first having it weighed on the scales at the DISPOSAL SITE;
 - (iii) drive a VEHICLE anywhere on the DISPOSAL SITE except on roads provided by the CAPITAL REGION for that purpose unless otherwise instructed;
 - (iv) act in a manner contrary to the posted SITE REGULATIONS;
 - having deposited the SOLID WASTE, fail to pay the applicable fee prescribed by this Bylaw.
- (c) No person shall deposit a PROHIBITED WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE.
- (d) No person shall deposit CONTROLLED WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE unless the ENGINEER has determined that special handling and disposal techniques are not required, or, where special handling and disposal techniques are required, the ENGINEER has determined that the CONTROLLED WASTE can be disposed of safely at the DISPOSAL SITE and has given written permission for the disposal. CONTROLLED WASTE for which special handling and disposal techniques are required are subject to the charges outlined in Schedule "C" of the Bylaw.
- (e) RECYCLABLE WASTE brought to the DISPOSAL SITE in SMALL LOADS will be accepted for disposal at the DISPOSAL SITE at no charge, provided that the charges set out in Section 1 (a) of Schedule "B" of the Bylaw shall be payable where the RECYCLABLE WASTE is not SOURCE-SEPARATED.

- (f) YARD AND GARDEN WASTE and PROCESSED YARD AND GARDEN WASTE will be accepted for disposal at the DISPOSAL SITE at the rates set out in Sections 1 (b) and (c) of Schedule "B" where;
 - it is brought to the DISPOSAL SITE in a SMALL LOAD and is SOURCE-SEPARATED; or
 - (ii) it is brought to the DISPOSAL SITE in a LOAD containing only YARD AND GARDEN WASTE; or
 - (iii) it is brought to the DISPOSAL SITE in a LOAD containing only PROCESSED YARD AND GARDEN WASTE.
- (g) If YARD AND GARDEN WASTE or PROCESSED YARD AND GARDEN WASTE is not SOURCE-SEPARATED or contains other than organic matter, then the person bringing the waste to the DISPOSAL SITE shall pay the charges set out in Section 1 (a) of Schedule "B".
- (h) CORRUGATED CARDBOARD and WHITE GOODS brought to the DISPOSAL SITE in SMALL LOADS will be accepted for disposal at the RECYCLING AREA at no charge. The charges set out in SECTION 1 (d) and (e) of Schedule "B" of the Bylaw shall be payable when the CORRUGATED CARDBOARD or WHITE GOODS are received at the DESIGNATED DUMPING AREA.
- (i) No person shall deposit a RESTRICTED WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE.

SECTION 3 - CHARGES

- (a) Every person depositing SOLID WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE shall pay to the CAPITAL REGION the applicable charges at the time and in the amount set out in Schedule "B" and, where applicable, the charges set out in Schedule "C", attached hereto.
- (b) Where a charge is not paid within the time specified in Schedule "B" for its payment, the person liable to pay such charge shall:
 - in addition to such charge, pay interest thereon at the rate set out in Schedule "B" from the date the charge was due to the date of payment;
 - (ii) not deposit any SOLID WASTE on or at the DISPOSAL SITE until such charge and interest owing thereon has been paid in full.

SECTION 4 - VIOLATIONS & PENALTIES

- (a) No person shall do any act or suffer or permit any act or thing to be done in contravention of this Bylaw.
- (b) Every person who contravenes this Bylaw, by doing any act which the Bylaw forbids or omits to do any act which the Bylaw requires to be done:
 - commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction, to a fine of not less than ONE HUNDRED (\$100) DOLLARS.
 - (ii) may be prohibited from depositing SOLID WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE.
- (c) The penalties imposed under subsection (b) hereof, shall be in addition to and not in substitution for any other penalty or remedy imposed by this Bylaw or any other statute, law or regulation.

(d) A separate offence shall be deemed to be committed upon each day during and in which the contravention occurs or continues.

SECTION 5 - SEVERANCE

- (a) If a section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Bylaw is for any reason held to be invalid by the decision of a Court in competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Bylaw.
- (b) Appendix "1" and Schedules "A", "B" and "C" inclusive of the Bylaw which are attached hereto form part of this Bylaw.

SECTION 6 - REPEAL

Bylaw No. 2033 is hereby repealed except insofar as it repeals any other bylaw.

SECTION 7 - TITLE

This Bylaw may be cited as "Hartland Landfill Tipping Fee and Regulation Bylaw No. 4, 1995".

This Bylaw shall take effect on 01 January 1996.

APPENDIX 1

CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

BYLAW NO. 2338

DISPOSAL SITE - means the Hartland Landfill site, more particularly described as:

First

- That part of Section 54, Highland District, lying to the south of a boundary parallel to the southern boundary of said Section and extending from a point on the easterly boundary of said Section distant 20.57 chains from the southeast corner of said Section.

Second - Section 55, Highland District.

Third - Section 65, Highland District.

Fourth - North half of Section 66, Highland District, containing 115 acres more or less.

Fifth - South half of Section 66, Highland District.

Sixth - East half of Section 79, Highland District.

SCHEDULE A

CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

BYLAW NO. 2338

SITE REGULATIONS

PURPOSE:

To ensure a safe and orderly environment for the staff and public at the DISPOSAL SITE.

POLICY:

These SITE REGULATIONS shall be observed by any person using the DISPOSAL SITE.

PROCEDURES:

1. VEHICLES

A VEHICLE will not be permitted on the DISPOSAL SITE if:

- (a) the VEHICLE's load exceeds the permitted weight limits set out in the regulations passed pursuant to the *Motor Vehicle Act*, or the *Commercial Transport Act*; or
- (b) it exceeds the posted speed limits; or
- it is noisy due to improper or poor muffling and braking systems; or
- (d) the load is poorly secured as to be noisy or dangerous.

LOADS

All LOADS of SOLID WASTE entering the DISPOSAL SITE shall be secured and covered. A cover shall be defined as a tarpaulin or other overlay that is used to confine the load to the VEHICLE. The following items will be permitted onto the DISPOSAL SITE without covers:

- (a) stumps chained on flat bed or within confines of truck box;
- (b) soil, sand, gravel, rock within the confines of their box (tailgates closed);
- (c) BULKY WASTES metal containers or manufactured items with a volume greater than one and a half (1.5) cubic metres (53 cubic feet/330 gallons) strapped on flat beds or within confines of truck box. Timbers greater than two and a half (2.5) metres in length.

A double charge will apply to all LOADS not meeting the above requirements.

DISPOSAL SITE

- (a) Any person delivering SOLID WASTE to the DISPOSAL SITE shall drive their VEHICLE only on the roads provided by the CAPITAL REGION.
- (b) Any person delivering SOLID WASTE to the DISPOSAL SITE shall deposit the SOLID WASTE in such a place and in such a manner as directed by the CAPITAL REGION staff or the landfill contractor.
- (c) All SOLID WASTE deposited at the DISPOSAL SITE shall become the property of the CAPITAL REGION.

- (d) Removal of deposited SOLID WASTE from the DISPOSAL SITE is prohibited except with written approval of the ENGINEER.
- (e) Loitering is not permitted on the DISPOSAL SITE. VEHICLES must proceed directly to the DESIGNATED DUMPING AREA then leave the DISPOSAL SITE as soon as possible after unloading.
- (f) The wash down facility is only for the use of VEHICLES using the ACTIVE FACE. Washing out interior of truck boxes is prohibited.

4. SAFETY

- (a) Any person entering the DISPOSAL SITE does so at their own risk. The CAPITAL REGION accepts no responsibility or liability for damage or injury to person or to property.
- (b) Children are not permitted on the DISPOSAL SITE except when they are inside a VEHICLE.
- (c) Smoking is not permitted within the DISPOSAL SITE.
- (d) All visitors to the DISPOSAL SITE must check in at the site office and complete the appropriate waiver forms.

GENERAL

(a) CONTROLLED WASTES must be manifested as required by the CAPITAL REGION and by the British Columbia Ministry of Environment, Lands and Parks. In addition, twenty-four (24) hours' notice is required prior to deposit of CONTROLLED WASTES at the DISPOSAL SITE. CONTROLLED WASTES will only be accepted Tuesday to Friday, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., except for gypsum board or wallboard which will be accepted during posted working hours.

In cases of emergency or hardship the ENGINEER may permit the deposit of CONTROLLED WASTE at any time at the DISPOSAL SITE.

- (b) These regulations are subject to change from time to time by the CAPITAL REGION.
- (c) Any person who contravenes these regulations or fails to comply with the posted notices and signs on the DISPOSAL SITE may be refused or prohibited re-entry onto the DISPOSAL SITE.

SCHEDULE B

CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

BYLAW NO. 2338

CHARGES

 The charge for depositing COVERED SOLID WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE effective 01 January 1996 or as noted is:

(a) REFUSE

- \$75.00 per tonne as measured by weight on the scale provided at the DISPOSAL SITE by the CAPITAL REGION, with a \$2.00 minimum charge; or
- (ii) As outlined in Schedule "C" for disposal of CONTROLLED WASTE.

(b) YARD AND GARDEN WASTE

\$20.00 per tonne as measured by weight on the scale provided at the DISPOSAL SITE by the CAPITAL REGION, with a \$2.00 minimum charge.

(c) PROCESSED YARD AND GARDEN WASTE

\$15.00 per tonne as measured by weight on the scale provided at the DISPOSAL SITE by the CAPITAL REGION, with a \$2.00 minimum charge.

(d) <u>CORRUGATED CARDBOARD</u>

Double the normal fee for loads of SOLID WASTE containing CORRUGATED CARDBOARD arriving at the DISPOSAL SITE in SMALL LOADS.

(e) WHITE GOODS

The fee to be charged for loads of SOLID WASTE containing WHITE GOODS shall be the normal fee for loads of SOLID WASTE plus \$50.00 per white good.

(f) ESTIMATED WEIGHTS

In the event that the scales provided are not operational, or in the event of traffic congestion, or at the discretion of the ENGINEER, weights shall be as estimated by the ENGINEER and a fee shall be charged as outlined in subsections (a), (b), (c) (d) and (e) above.

- The fee to be charged for all loads of SOLID WASTE which arrive at the DISPOSAL SITE uncovered shall be double the normal fee for loads of COVERED SOLID WASTE.
- 3. All charges referred to in Sections 1 or 2 shall be rounded up or down to the nearest quarter of a dollar.
- All charges payable under this bylaw shall be paid in cash prior to the deposit of the SOLID WASTE for which the charge is made.
- 5. Notwithstanding Section 4, where the charge for depositing is under Section 1, the charge payable shall be paid following the weighing of the empty truck after the load is deposited and shall be based on the difference in weight between the loaded weight and the weight of the empty truck.

- 6. Notwithstanding Sections 4 and 5, any person depositing SOLID WASTE at the DISPOSAL SITE on a regular basis may apply to the CAPITAL REGION for credit and if the TREASURER is satisfied of the credit worthiness of the person he or she may grant credit to that person, in which case payment of the charge imposed under Section 1 shall be made and the credit extended on the following conditions:
 - (a) the person receiving credit shall pay to the CAPITAL REGION all charges in full within thirty (30) days of the last day of the month for which an invoice has been submitted. The CAPITAL REGION will invoice monthly for SOLID WASTE delivered during the preceding month. The invoice amount will be based on the total quantity of SOLID WASTE delivered during the month, and the posted disposal rates in effect at the time of delivery;
 - (b) late payment(s) will be subject to an interest penalty charge of 1.5% per month;
 - (c) the CAPITAL REGION reserves the right to cancel, upon five (5) days' notice, the credit offered herein for late payment, nonpayment or other justified cause as judged solely by the TREASURER.

APPENDIX A

SUMMARY OF BYLAW AMENDMENTS

February 1993 - Bylaw 2079: required to enforce the ban of corrugated cardboard and white goods.

August 1993 - Bylaw 2146: required to enforce the ban of directories and tires.

January 1995 - Bylaw 2280: required to:

 enforce the ban of aggregate, asphalt, clean soil, concrete, rubble and scrap metal;

classify asbestos cement material and soot as controlled waste; and

reduce the minimum penalty to \$100.

May 1995 - Bylaw 2302: required to regulate household quantities of recyclable items which could be accepted at the recycling area (tires - 5; white goods - 2; used oil filters - 5;

lead acid batteries - 2; and refillable or non-refillable propane tanks - 2).
