## COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

#### **DETAILED FUNDING GUIDELINES**



#### Labour

1. As the foundation of any community clean-up program is volunteer based, labour costs are not eligible for funding.

### **Equipment Purchase & Rental**

- 1. The <u>rental</u> cost of containers for the collection of recyclables and/or garbage is eligible for funding. This may include standard roll-off containers, metal bins, wheeled totes, blue boxes and residential style garbage cans.
- 2. The <u>rental</u> cost of equipment for the collection of recyclables and garbage such as vehicles, tractors, cranes, trailers, barges, rakes, shovels, pick sticks or other tools is eligible for funding.
- 3. The <u>purchase</u> of refuse and recyclables containers, equipment, tools or other capital equipment of any kind is NOT eligible for funding with the exception of the following:
  - Garbage Bags The cost of purchasing garbage bags to be used in the collection of recyclables and garbage is eligible for funding. Although garbage bags may be viewed as a capital cost, they are essential in any clean-up program and they cannot realistically be rented and must therefore be purchased. NOTE: The CRD has been given a limited supply of complementary garbage bags and clear bags (for recyclables collection) from First Brands Canada (Glad bags) for distribution to interested community clean-up groups. The bags are available on a first come, first served basis.
  - Gloves The cost of purchasing gloves for use in the collection of recyclables and garbage is eligible for funding. Gloves are required to ensure a minimum level of hygiene and safety.

# **Transportation & Hauling**

 Costs to transport recyclables and garbage to a processing facility/market or disposal site are eligible for funding. This may include the cost of hiring a hauling contractor or expenses incurred through self-hauling such as the vehicle mileage (paid at the CRD rate), vehicle rental (including taxes, insurance and fuel) and ferry tickets.

### **Processing & Marketing**

- 1. Fees to pay the cost of recycling materials with a negative value such as container glass are eligible for funding. This expense must be net of any revenues obtained from the sale of other recyclables with a positive value.
- 2. The overall project cost must be net of any revenue generated through the marketing of recyclable materials.

# **Disposal Fees**

1. Fees to pay the cost of disposing of unrecyclable garbage are eligible for funding.

### Other Expenses Not Eligible for Funding

- 1. the cost of meals, refreshments or other food and drink items
- 2. prizes for participants or other items to be given away
- 3. project administration costs
- 4. plants, seeds, soil or other items related to horticulture or for use in re-vegetating an area after clean-up
- 5. project promotion expenses
