Technical Notes

With every Census there are inevitably a certain number of persons who are missed by the Census Enumerators and therefore not counted. The estimates for this undercount have not yet been applied to the data overleaf.

Footnotes

1. Nations Reserves in the Core include*: Esquimalt, Songhees (New Songhees 1A).
2. First Nations Reserves on the Peninsula include*: Pauquachin (Cole Bay 3), Tseycum (Union Bay 4), Tsawout (East Saanich 2), Tsartlip (South Saanich 1).
3. First Nations Reserves in the WestShore include*: Scia'new (Beecher Bay 1), T-Sou-ke, Pacheedaht (Gordon River 2).
4. First Nations Reserves in the Southern Gulf Islands Electoral Area (EA) include*: Penelakut (Galiano Island 9), Mayne Island 6.
5. On December 6, 1999, a portion of the former Sooke EA was incorporated as the District of Sooke. The remaining unincorporated portion of the Sooke EA, together with the Langford EA, were combined into a new Juan de Fuca EA because the incorporation of the District of Sooke occurred after the taking of the 1996 Census, demographics are not available for the District of Sooke nor the Juan de Fuca EA for the 1996 Census. Demographics for these new jurisdictions are, however, included in the 2001 Census data.
6. 2006 Census Population counts are for geographic boundaries as of January 1, 2006. Changes to Sooke's and Juan de Fuca E.A.'s boundaries due to Sooke boundary extensions to the East (Gillespie Road) and to the West (Kemp Lake/West Coast Road) in February 2006 are not reflected in these counts.
7. 2011 Census population counts for Juan de Fuca EA were revised with the release of the 2016 Census.
8. (*) Statistics Canada only recognizes the subset of First Nations Reserves that are populated (or potentially populated) as Census subdivisions.
