Open letter to Shoreline School and surrounding residents:

CRAIGFLOWER PUMP STATION – PROGRESS UPDATE FOR FEBRUARY 2015

As a follow up to our last notification letter distributed in September of 2014, this letter provides a progress update for the Craigflower Pump Station project.

The contractor, Jacob Brothers Construction, has completed approximately 80% of the piping works from the old pump station, through the Shoreline Middle School field over to the new pump station, including the trenchless crossing of Portage Inlet. It is anticipated that the pipe work will be complete in March 2015 and restoration will follow. As part of the restoration work the CRD has partnered with the Shoreline Middle School and the Town of View Royal to install a new trail from Shoreline Drive over to Island Highway. This trail will provide the community with better access to the E&N Rail Trail and Portage Park. Stay tuned for more details as a trail opening is being planned for late Spring. The attached map on the back of this letter shows the approximate location of the new trail.

The new Craigflower Pump Station building has reached 80% completion and the remainder of the equipment is now being installed. The architectural finishes have commenced and it is anticipated that final restoration will be completed later this Spring.

We offer our thanks and appreciation to the Shoreline Middle School and the community for their cooperation and understanding while this work is being completed. Please continue to be careful while travelling around the work zone areas and for your safety, please obey all traffic signs and flag persons.

Seatera Program staff will continue to keep the Shoreline School and the Town of View Royal staff informed of the work as it progresses.
